For this reason the UK Government had decided to abolish examination of Panjabi A Level from 2017. However, Panjabi language supporters are campaigning to increase this number and for the first time after eight years, the number of Panjabi GCSE and A Level student entries have increased in June 2016. Therefore, the UK Government cancelled the plan to abolish examinations of Panjabi A Level from 2017.

The BBC World Service also announced that they will launch BBC Panjabi TV service worldwide and BBC Panjabi Radio service worldwide. Panjabi language campaign stages, news and letters of these achievements can be seen at www.panjabi2021.co.uk.

In UK census 2001, Panjabi language was the second most spoken language in the UK. But unfortunately, Panjabi language became the third most spoken language in the UK census of 2011, after Polish. The Panjabi community working hard to bring Panjabi language back to the second most spoken language in the upcoming UK census of 2021.

The Panjabi community is overjoyed that you are the Consul General of India in Birmingham and we have great expectations from you. We would be grateful if you advise us in raising awareness for Panjabi language because you are also part of the Panjabi community. Thank you very much.
